Composition Correction Codes

U : A circle is the most popular correction; signifies that there is an error in
grammar and/or spelling; errors range from subject-verb form agreement, gender
and number, subject and adjective agreement; problems with the indicative or
subjunctive; problems with tenses; accent marks; all pronouns; adverbs; improper
use of problem verbs (ser, estar, hay, gustar, etc., etc., etc., etc., etc.).
: An underlined word signifies a problem in vocabulary (i.e. word choice);
most often this is the result of translating an English word or an expression
verbatim into Spanish or creating non-existent words (SPANGLISH) with no
consideration for the context; inappropriate use of a Spanish word, etc. This also
signifies that a more sophisticated or precise word can be used. Proper use of a
dictionary can eliminate these errors.
[]: Brackets signify a problem with syntax: word order or sentence structure. The
intended meaning of the sentence(s) may also be unclear. Therefore, student might
consider erasing the sentence or paragraph and starting over.
?: Signifies that the marked text is incomprehensible.
X: signifies that the element can be eliminated.
211 Signifies that the element can be eliminated.
∧: Signifies something is missing.
: Signifies elements need to be reversed.
R is used to indicate repetition.
